

## RINGING ON HOLT ISLAND 26<sup>TH</sup> – 27<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER 2018

The weather was generally sunny and calm so ideal for ringing. We caught so many Great Tits and Blue Tits on the first day that we were unable to put up all the nets until dusk. The Blue Tits in particular came in groups of 8 - 10 with 50% un-ringed, in spite of all that were ringed last month.

There were two birds we ringed in January 2015 which we re-trapped, a Robin and a Blue Tit. One of the Blackbirds we caught was a continental bird, a juvenile female which was still partially moulting its upper body feathers but had very mottled breast feathers.

We noted a number of Red Admiral and Speckled Wood butterflies and many dragonflies.
